Tips and Tweaks

1. Airing Down your tires can help you gain traction. Typically you don't want to air down less than 10 PSI unless you have bead-lock rims.
2. When off-roading, always place the largest obstacle you must conquer directly in front of your tire and drive over it. Don't try to straddle it with your tires.
3. When traversing a gorge or a ravine, if the sides aren't too steep try going through it at an angle of about 45 degrees. This will allow you to keep as many tires on the ground as possible and maintain maximum traction.
4. When fording deep water, enter the water slowly, and then gain a few miles an hour of extra speed. Back off the throttle slightly and then get right back at the same speed. This will create a bow wave in front of you and dramatically lower the water.
5. For manual transmission owners: If you stall your rig when headed uphill, try starting your rig while in 1st gear, low range to keep from rolling backwards. Most new vehicles can't do this unless you bypass the clutch/starter disablement.
